ROLL CALL & MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Upon a motion made seconded, the Minutes of the December 15th, 1988 Board of Directors Meeting were accepted as submitted.

Mrs. M. Scofield complemented Ms. Linefsky on her recent edition of the Educational/Vocational Newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Epstein presented the Treasurer's Report. After discussion, the Treasurer's Report was accepted as submitted.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Tisch introduced Ms. Lynn Halbfinger, a new Member of the F.E.G.S. Board.

a. Three Minute Video Presentation Of Segment of NBC National News

This video tape describes how difficult it is for business to fill entry level positions which now have a much higher level of reading and basic mathematical requirements than in previous years. Today, there is a need for some kind of skills training even for basic entry level occupations. F.E.G.S.' New York City Furniture Institute was viewed on the tape and the accompanying commentary pointed out that there are currently five thousand jobs available in the industry.

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Mr. A. Miller commented that one of the reasons he wanted the Board to see this video tape was so that everyone would understand the critical importance skills training now plays in helping men and women prepare for employment. Our Capital Campaign proposal to UJA-Federation also includes a request for an Endowment Fund for skills training. This Endowment Fund would provide income for scholarships for individuals who have been excluded from government funded training programs, because their income level exceeds \$5,500 per year. This Endowment Fund would place emphasis on persons forty-five years of age and over and on Russian immigrants not eligible for government funded training.

Mrs. Scofield asked about funding for women over the age of forty.

Mr. A. Miller noted that in many instances, displaced homemakers' money is available for this population. Our endowment request is for people with no means of funding and, of course, while we might emphasize people over forty-five years of age, it does not exclude people less than forty-five.

Mr. A. Miller read to the Board the addendum that was submitted to UJA-Federation regarding our Endowment Fund request <see attached>, and noted that there may be a large gift (approximately \$1 Million) from a donor with a particular interest in this Endowment Fund.

Mr. A. Miller stressed the importance of the endowment portion of our capital request. He stated that capital construction monies may be eligible in many instances for government funding, but there is no chance of government funding for skills training for this targeted population.

Mr. Tisch asked for a Sense of the Board regarding their approval to stress the Endowment Fund for Skills Training request at the Capital Campaign Budget Hearing at UJA-Federation.

The Sense of the Board was unanimous for approval.

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b. <u>UJA-Federation Capital Campaign Budget Hearing, February 8th, 1989, 2:00 - 4:00 P.M.</u>

Mr. Tisch stressed that the Capital Campaign Budget Hearing is a particularly important meeting and asked for Board participation. We will present our capital campaign proposal before the UJA-Federation Distribution Committee.

c. UJA-Federation Mission to Rome & Israel March 5th - 16th, 1989

Mr. Tisch announced to the Board that this Mission is for all who contribute more than \$5,000 to the UJA-Federation Campaign. The trip will be paid for by the Campaign. It promises to be an interesting experience. Details were distributed at the last Board meeting.

Mr. A. Miller encouraged Board members to join in UJA-Federation's Annual Albany Mission. This is an opportunity for committed volunteer lay leadership to meet with Governor Cuomo, Senate Head Marino, House Speaker Miller and other officials. It is a unique opportunity for UJA-Federation to present its case for increased funding for human services. There will be a train leaving 7:30 A.M. from Grand Central Station and returning to New York City at approximately 7:30 P.M. So far, Messrs. Tisch, Lehrman, Oltchick and Mrs. Levy plan to attend.

PROCLAMATION TO MR. ALFRED P. MILLER

Mr. Tisch presented the Board's Proclamation, which was read at the previous Board meeting, to Mr. A. Miller "With an awful lot of love... We are very proud of the job you are doing and hope we will have another twenty-five more years of service". The

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Proclamation was designed by Mr. Marvin Sperling, F.E.G.S.' Director of Media Services.

F.E.G.S.' BOARD EDUCATION MEETING, FEBRUARY 16TH, 1989

Mr. Tisch announced that our Annual Board Education Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 16th, 1989, 4:00 P.M. - 7:00 P.M., at F.E.G.S.' Executive Office, 114 Fifth Avenue, New York City, 11th Floor Conference Room (a light dinner will be served).

Mrs. M. Scofield, Chair, Planning & Review, Public Relations/Marketing & Board Education Committee, noted that this meeting replaces F.E.G.S.' February Board Meeting. This year, the Agenda will be a discussion of the impact of the Bush administration (i.e. federal funding), the Albany funding picture and a discussion of the new problems emerging with the increased Soviet immigration. We are planning to invite Mr. Mark Handleman, Executive Director of New York Association for New Americans (NYANA) to discuss the immigration situation.

UJA-FEDERATION DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE SITE VISIT TO F.E.G.S., JANUARY 12TH, 1989. MANY F.E.G.S. BOARD MEMBERS ATTENDED

Mr. Tisch stated this year's UJA-Federation Distribution Committee's Site Visit to F.E.G.S. was highly successful. The highlight of the visit was a presentation by four clients of F.E.G.S., each representing a different service of F.E.G.S. and each with a poignant story. All of the clients said they were greatly helped by F.E.G.S.

Mr. Tisch commented that what was so evident was the "dedication, patience and love of the staff who do this work day in and day out".

Mr. A. Miller also mentioned a recent \$3.00 check with a wonderful note which we received from someone who was helped to find a job by F.E.G.S.' Mobile Van. He stated he could not afford a larger contribution, but wanted to show his appreciation <see attached>.

EDUCATIONAL & VOCATIONAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

Mr. Bresler reported that at the last meeting of the Educational & Vocational

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Services Committee held on December 22nd, 1988, in addition to Board members, was attended by Ms. Rae Linefsky, F.E.G.S.' Senior Vice President, Educational/Vocational Services, Ms. Barbara Zerzan, F.E.G.S. Director of the Comprehensive Employment Opportunity Support Center Program (C.E.O.S.C.) and Ms. Karen Zuckerman, F.E.G.S. Supervisor of the Volunteer/Internship Program. The main topic of discussion was the enormous problems of the clients as well as the system which regulates the services.

Ms. Linefsky prepared a list of all the goods and services that C.E.O.S.C. clients can benefit from <see attached> and encouraged the Board to help provide these items wherever possible.

Mr. Bresler stated that he would like to invite Board members to future meetings of the Educational & Vocational Services Committee, because the topics are so important for everyone to be aware of.

Mr. Tisch asked about the Agency's use of volunteers.

Mr. A. Miller noted that while at one time the Agency did not have volunteers, we now have thirty-five volunteers at various locations throughout F.E.G.S. After discussion, it was recommended we increase the use of volunteers at F.E.G.S.

Mr. Henshel recommended we contact specific publishers for donations of children's books for C.E.O.S.C. clients.

Ms. Linefsky stated that she will provide a list of these companies to Mr. Henshel and other Board members.

Mr. Stein recommended that we contact community service programs at Horace Mann High School as well as other private high schools for internship and volunteer opportunities.

Mr. Bresler noted that at the Educational/Vocational Services Committee meeting, he asked those present if they sense an abuse of the system by our clients. Our staff consistently replied that of those clients who volunteer to come to F.E.G.S., abuse of the system in not sensed.

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PROGRAM UPDATES

a. <u>Educational/Vocational Services</u>

Ms. Linefsky reported on F.E.G.S.' participation in the Project Gain Conference.

F.E.G.S.' Project Gain program works with homeless youth. This conference was attended by government and community officials and our services were highlighted and commended.

b. Mental Health

Mr. Shumsker reported that F.E.G.S.' Intensive Supportive Apartment Program and Brooklyn Day Program were both audited by the New York State Office of Mental Health. It was the first time that both programs had been audited and we had only a few weeks notice to prepare. At the exit conference, F.E.G.S. was commended for the quality of both of these programs.

Mr. Shumsker also noted that we are actively looking for apartments in Queens, New York to further expand our residential services to the mentally ill. He commented that we are in discussion with the New York State Office of Mental Health as well as the New York City Department of Health to track in-patients ready for discharge and place them in our Day Programs. Usually, clients in psychiatric hospitals cannot have the benefit of Medicaid treatment services. Many fall through the cracks. This program would be funded by community support system money.

c. Mental Retardation

Ms. Rambeau announced that F.E.G.S. has implemented the Salary Enhancement money promised by the State. Staff were pleased with this raise, which helps us retain needed staff at F.E.G.S.

d. Educational Services

Mr. Feldman announced that both he and Ms. Margolin, F.E.G.S.' Associate

Executive Vice President-Operations, gave extensive information when they were guests
on the Bernard Meltzer Radio Program, January 7th, 1989, describing the services of

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F.E.G.S. as well as the educational services offered by the Agency.

Mr. Gershon informed the Board that so far, there have been more than sixty-five telephone calls in response to this program.

Mr. Feldman reported that at our Operation Success Program at Erasmus Hall High School, Brooklyn, our staff have been actively participating in in-service training. The school (Erasmus Hall High School) asked F.E.G.S. staff to train their Case Managers, a compliment to the Agency.

Mr. Feldman added that Erasmus Hall High School also had a visit by the Vice President of the Board of Education, Irene Impellizzeri, who followed this visit by a complimentary letter about Operation Success and Erasmus Hall High School <see attached>.

Mr. A. Miller introduced Mrs. Suda McCormick, F.E.G.S.' Executive Secretary and Mr. Marvin Sperling, F.E.G.S.' Director-Media Services, and complimented Mrs. McCormick for her extraordinary work behind the scenes and Mr. Sperling for the excellent job he does producing all of the Agency's printed materials, films and brochures. Because of Mr. Sperling, F.E.G.S. won two awards for our printed material (i.e. F.E.G.S.' 50th Anniversary Annual Report and the Circle of Care Brochure).

Mr. Tisch announced to the Board that he appreciates the full and frank discussions that the Board has about the many issues affecting F.E.G.S. With an Agency the size of ours we continuously have so many positive things to report.

Both Mr. Tisch and Mr. A. Miller said that they trust that even if the news were not positive, it is important to continue open productive dialogues.

Upon a motion made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned.

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F.E.G.S., as stated in our original Proposal, seeks to establish an Endowment Fund in the amount of \$5 Million. The purpose of this Endowment Fund is to provide skills training for those individuals, especially from the Jewish community, who have been excluded from government sponsored skills training, because their income level exceeds \$5,770 per year. F.E.G.S. has used its own limited funds along with some scholarship assistance in the past, but has had to turn away hundreds of individuals who desperately need to learn skills necessary for obtaining a job and a career. F.E.G.S. has already stated in its original Endowment Fund goal description that we wish to use the income from the Endowment Fund to provide scholarships for Jewish men and women as well as other middle-class individuals. The emphasis and priority for the receipt of scholarship assistance from the Endowment fund will be placed on those individuals forty-five years of age and older who, with increasing number, find themselves needing to work for economic as well as psychological and health reasons, but lack the skills necessary to obtain even a half way decent job.

There still exists in this country discrimination against the older worker, with many employers considering older workers to be anyone fifty years of age and in some cases forty-five years of age and older. The chances of getting a job are increased geometrically when someone over forty-five years of age has the skills required by a potential employer. It is these skills we wish to impart to this population.

From a UJA-Federation and public policy point of view, it has been demonstrated that an individual who is gainfully employed, preferably with pride in what he/she is doing, requires less support and social services and remains active within the community for many more years than an individual in the same age range who cannot find employment.

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Our second emphasis for the use of these endowment funds will be to address the increasing needs of Russian Jewish Immigrants who are coming to this country many of whom will be ineligible for government funding. We plan to offer Russian Jewish Immigrants, and future Jewish Immigrants from other countries, not only training at F.E.G.S.'s existing and broad range business and trades school, but to also establish additional courses geared to the specific needs and capabilities of the new Russian Jewish Immigrants.

Without this Endowment Fund and the income it will generate each year,

F.E.G.S. cannot begin to meet the skills training needs of the Jewish community and
without skills attainment, many of these people will be unemployed. Without
employment, many of these people will require extensive and expensive human
services from UJA-Federation agencies.

It has long been an established maxim that:

"Give a man a fish and he will eat for a day. Give a man a fishing rod, teach him how to fish and he will eat for a lifetime".

F.E.G.S. helps thousands of people attain the skills necessary to get a good job and eat for a lifetime, but, because of public policy laws and funding we have not been able to do the same for the vast majority of middle-class Jews. Together, we can accomplish this necessary and vital mission.

Those who contribute to make this Endowment fund a reality will know that their name is associated with services that will continue forever, regardless of which building those services are provided in. Their contribution will assure a systemic change and assure middle-class Jews that they, too, can live "The American Dream". We owe it to the community to make this possible.

BELLE DESCRIPTION OF PROCEETY PROJECT:

Employment requires the acquisition of skills targeted to meet the needs of industry.

Unemployment in the Jewish community has been a pressing concern since the early 1980's.

Many Jews who seek employment need training and/or retraining to enable them to compete for today's job opportunities.

For almost two decades, F.E.G.S. has offered through its New York State licensed Trades and Business School skills training in a variety of business and trade occupations. Traditionally, individuals who participate in these programs receive tuition sponsorship by one of many government agencies. As government funding has become more restrictive, fewer individuals, and particularly fewer Jewish men and women, qualify for government sponsorship. Likewise, neither they nor their families are able to afford the approved tuition.

To assure the Jewish community the opportunity for economic security through employment, F.E.G.S. proposes to establish a \$5,000,000 endowment fund to enable the Agency to award between \$400,000-500,000 annually in scholarship assistance to up to 100 men and women to participate in one of the Agency's Skills Training Programs. The endowment will be supported primarily (\$4,000,000) by industry and Foundations. A \$1,000,000 challenge grant (50 chairs at \$20,000 each) is requested from UJA-Federation toward achieving this goal.

This figure of \$3,200,000 represents the current operating budget of the F.E.G.S. Trades and Business School and the New York City Furniture Institute. The endowment fund that is requested will not result in any additional operating costs, as it will provide income to purchase training slots for eligible, financially at risk, primarily Jewish men and women who, without this assistance, would not be able to attend.




