

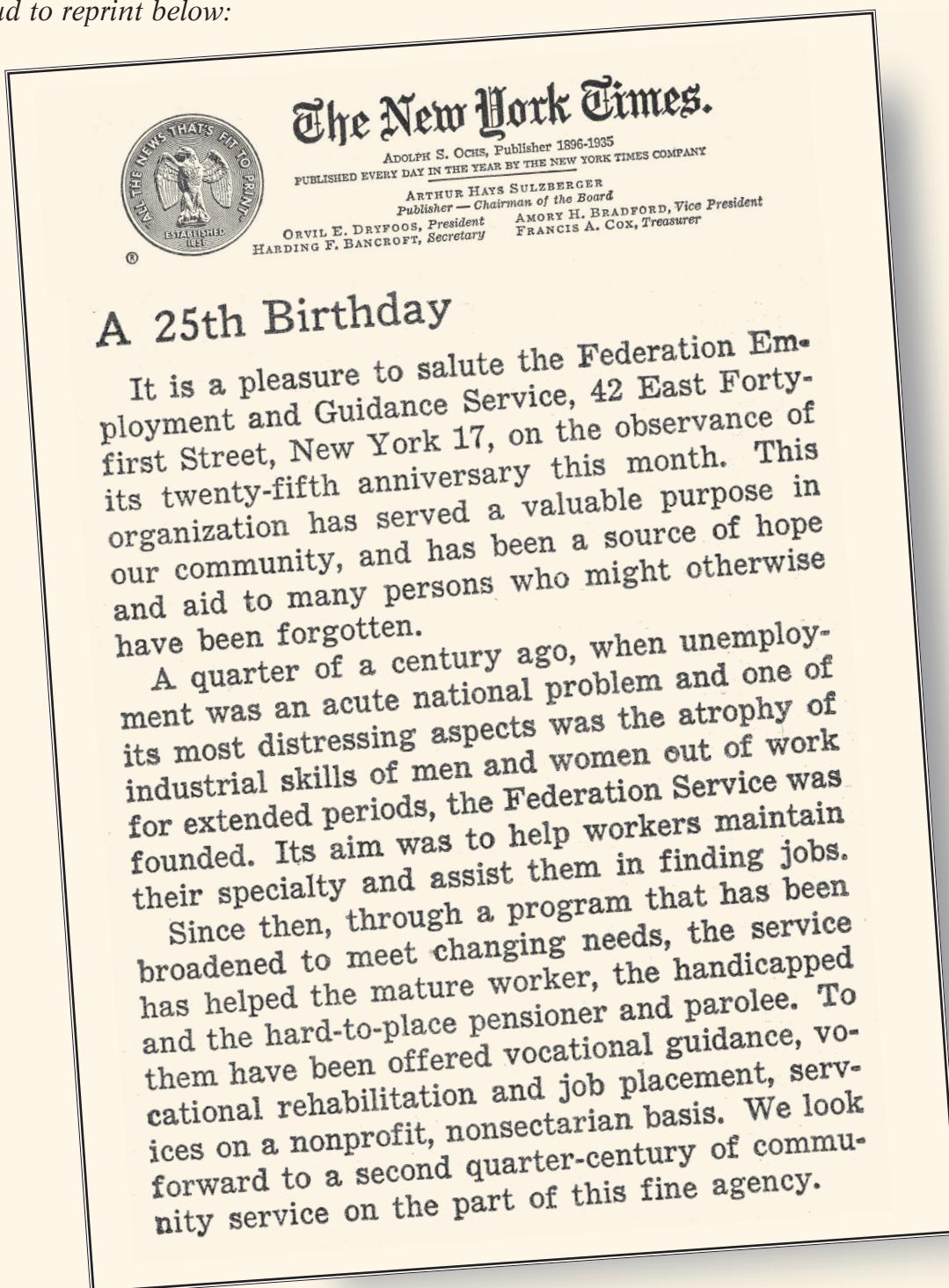
As part of F·E·G·S's 70th Anniversary year, we will be sharing a series of historical perspectives that relate to the development, achievements and growth of F·E·G·S.

25 YEARS OF SERVICE · 1960

In April of 1960, F·E·G·S marked its 25th anniversary with a luncheon at the Waldorf-Astoria, attended by some 300 leaders from the community, government, politics, and other organizations. Featured speakers were John J. Theobald, the New York City Board of Education's Superintendent of Schools, and Gustave L. Levy, President of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York.

Among those sending their congratulations was President Dwight D. Eisenhower, who wrote, "Inspired by a generous humanitarian concern, this organization has performed a splendid service...I am sure it will continue to add strength to the lives of many citizens and their communities." New York's Governor, Nelson A. Rockefeller, wrote, "Your agency has established a most commendable record of helpfulness where help is sorely needed. Its services . . . have won widespread and well-merited recognition."
