FINDING EMPLOYMENT · 1930's

Emerging from *The Great Depression*, Federation Employment Service was mandated to help find jobs for thousands of New Yorkers. FES moved quickly to establish itself as a leader in the career and employment fields. In its first year, it registered more than 8,500 individuals, and helped over 2,200 find jobs. Below is a summary of FES's first year of activity and its outreach materials.
