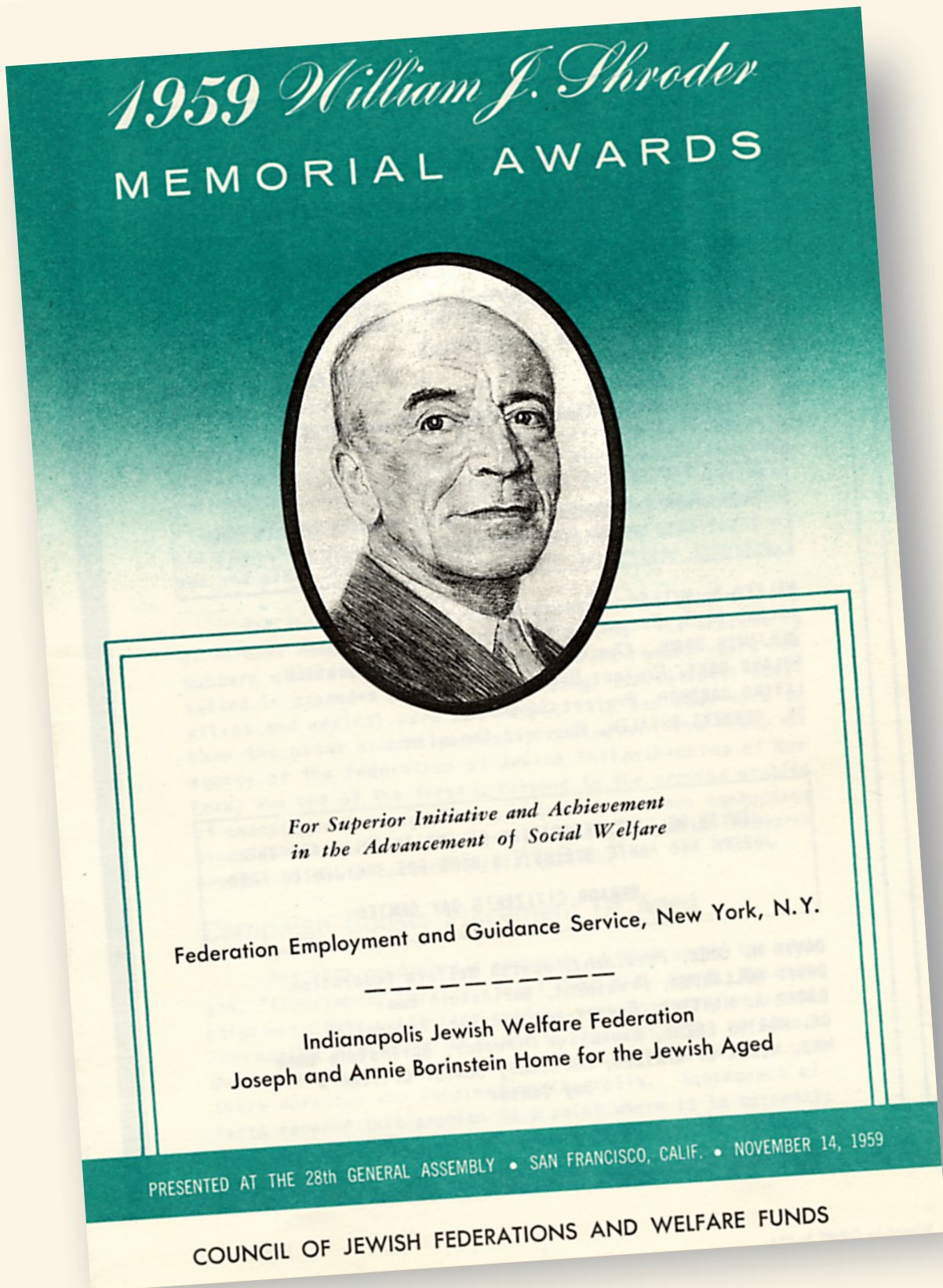


As part of F·E·G·S's 70th Anniversary year, we will be sharing a series of historical perspectives that relate to the development, achievements and growth of F·E·G·S.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR SERVICES TO THE OLDER WORKER

In 1959, F·E·G·S received the prestigious William J. Shroder Memorial Award from the Council of Jewish Federations (now part of UJC, the United Jewish Communities) for its decade-long efforts to stimulate employment of older workers. In presenting the award, the Council said, "One of the most outstanding achievements in this area of service has been F·E·G·S's pioneering project to prove the value of rehabilitation services for vocationally handicapped persons 60 years of age and older, and to help them return to private industry." The award was given for "superior initiative and achievement in the advancement of social welfare."
